



### Impact of Pupil Premium funding 2018-19

A sum of £64, 724 was allocated to Wellfield Middle School in the academic year 2018-19. The table below shows where the funding was allocated, the associated costs and the impact on students. The school uses the funding to improve outcomes for disadvantaged students through a combination of quality teaching for all and focused spending according to the areas of greatest need linked to wellbeing, attainment and progress.

Small group interventions led by Teacher or Teaching Assistant.	£26000	Structured interventions followed and reviewed then developed for increased impact.
Inclusion manager	£15000	Support for vulnerable pupils through triage
Homework Club staffed at lunchtime by Teaching Assistant.	£3000	Homework completion an expectation across the school.
Purchase of hens, housing and day to day care.	£1000	Improved punctuality and attendance for targeted children.
Construction of building to house indoor gym.	£4000	Opportunities for personal wellbeing and engagement with school.

Part funding of Pupil Premium lead (SLT) and Pupil Premium Champion (teacher).	£700	Regular and detailed review and adaptation of strategies to increase effectiveness in all areas.
Pupil premium review (school to school) and leadership support from WHS	£4000	Expertise shared to advise on how to increase effectiveness of PP strategy.
Thrive training for 2 members of staff.	£2000	Work to be developed further on emotional wellbeing, enabling children to better focus and concentrate in lessons
Target setting days for Pupil Premium children and their parents.	£500	Increased parental engagement.
